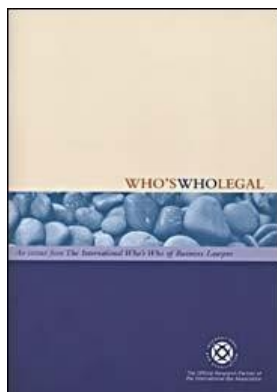


WHO'S WHO LEGAL: LIFE SCIENCES 2008
